Daniel J. Valadas Chief of Police

- 1774: First Annual Town Meeting held; John Sikes and Jacob Cooley serve as Constables.
- 1870: Ludlow appoints Storrs Stebbins as a Special Police Officer.
- 1900: Hall E. Storer appointed as first permanent Police Officer.
- 1907: William Consedine appt Police Officer. Watchmen stations installed in Jenksville.
- 1913: William Consedine appointed Chief of Police.
- 1918: Orrin Cash is appointed Chief of Police.
- 1925: Joseph Fouche appointed Chief of Police. First Overland Police Cruiser is purchased.
- 1926: Gamewell signal system with 6 call boxes is installed in the Village of Jenksville.
- 1927: Flashing beacons installed to summon police. Female and Juvenile cells added to station.
- 1927: Five Officials are indicted-including Joseph Fouche (Chief of Police).
- 1928: Chief Fouche discharged. In November, Raymond Miller appointed Chief of Police.
- 1933: James Raiche appointed Chief of Police. He had served as Springfield Police Lieutenant.
- 1935: John McGrath appointed Chief of Police on May 2, 1935.
- 1955: Alexander Thompson appointed Chief of Police.
- 1967: New Public Safety Complex opened at Chapin and Center Streets.
- 1968: John Jorge appointed Chief of Police. Special Police Unit started under his command.
- 1971: Breathalyzer instrument acquired by the department.
- 1975: Department Staffing: Chief of Police, Lieutenant, 5 Sergeants, 20 Patrolmen, 1 Matron.
- 1993: James J. McGowan appointed Chief of Police.
- 1995: Community Policing Initiative & Bike Patrols (COPS) undertaken by the department.
- 1999: Permanent School Resource Officer assigned to Ludlow High School.
- 2002: K9 program started by the department, "Cito" first K-9.
- 2014: Pablo P. Madera appointed Chief of Police.
- 2018: MPAC certification achieved by the agency.
- 2020: Daniel J. Valadas appointed 11th Ludlow, Massachusetts Chief of Police.
- 2023: Current Ludlow Police Staffing: 3 Lts., 8 Sgts., 32 Ptlm., 20 Specials Pol., 13 Dispatch, 3 Clerks.
